



Access to Nature Regional Targeting Plan – East Midlands

Introduction

The East Midlands region covers approximately 15,627 km² comprising Derbyshire, Leicestershire, Lincolnshire, Northamptonshire, Nottinghamshire and Rutland. Over 4 million people live in the East Midlands region-with the primary centres of population in Leicester, Nottingham and Derby. Northampton and Lincoln are other large settlements in the region. However, the East Midlands is the 3rd most rural region in England with around 30% of the population living in rural settlements, which is well above the national average. As the birth rate falls and the population ages there are more older people and fewer younger people living in the East Midlands.

The East Midlands' has been identified as an area for new housing. The New Growth Points are the 3 Cities of Derby, Leicester and Nottingham together with Grantham, Newark-on-Trent and Lincoln.

Regional Priorities

This document identifies areas and beneficiaries that are seen as a particular priority for Natural England's 'Access to Nature' scheme in the East Midlands Region. These regional priorities reflect the national scheme's priorities, targets and outcomes, further informed by regional knowledge and evidence.

The purpose of the plan is:

- 1) To encourage applicants to develop proposals that will deliver the identified priorities within the limited budgets for the 'Access to Nature' Scheme.
- 2) To aid the assessment process to ensure that projects are targeted in accordance with the priorities described in the plan.

It should be noted that the plan is not a mechanism for approving (or not approving) individual applications, which will all be considered on their own merits.



Applicants should first meet all the **eligibility criteria** of the scheme. Applications should also accord with the scheme's **priorities, outcomes and targets**. To increase the chances of a successful application you are advised to read through the priorities in this targeting statement. Applicants should note that this is a qualitative process – applications do not need to address all the

targets described. This list is not exhaustive, and many proposals not covered by the targeting statement may still receive funding.

Applicants are required and encouraged to submit their own evidence of need in support of their application. As 'Access to Nature' is an open application scheme, the onus is on the applicant to demonstrate that their proposal will benefit those who currently have a low level of access, and / or engagement, with the natural environment.

Applicants are encouraged to speak with their local Natural England adviser before they commit to the time and expense of applying for grant aid. Contacts are listed at Annex A .

Applications to 'Access to Nature' in the East Midlands

1. Geographic Target Areas

1. Applications will be prioritised geographically. **Those that originate from or work with communities living in the lowest 10% most deprived urban and 10% most deprived rural wards by Super Output Area, identified through the Index of Multiple Deprivation 2007 (IMD) statistics will be a priority.** We will use standard census data to identify these locations. Overall higher levels of deprivation in the East Midlands as measured by the IMD are concentrated in the urban centres, the former coalfields and the Lincolnshire coast. IMD lists by super output area are available in the Annex C.

2. Applications from communities which address environmental deprivation and the lack of provision of freely accessible green space, or provide opportunities to remove barriers to accessing areas of existing green space to those communities living in the lowest 10% of most deprived urban and rural areas will be a priority.

3. Applications aimed at communities outside the lowest 10%, but meeting these other priorities, will need to make a case for mitigating factors or provide additional supporting information.

The application will need to show local justification if the general area falls outside the lowest 10% most deprived urban and rural wards. Supporting evidence could be in the form of:

- Community consultations
- Local Health Statistics
- Maps to show lack of access to green space
- Parish Plans
- Letters of Support

2. Priority Groups

1. People currently under-represented in terms of contact with the natural environment, including disabled people, young people, black and ethnic minority communities and older people.
2. Communities and individuals experiencing social exclusion through disability, unemployment, age or economic disadvantage.
3. People disadvantaged by where they live through lack of access to the natural environment.

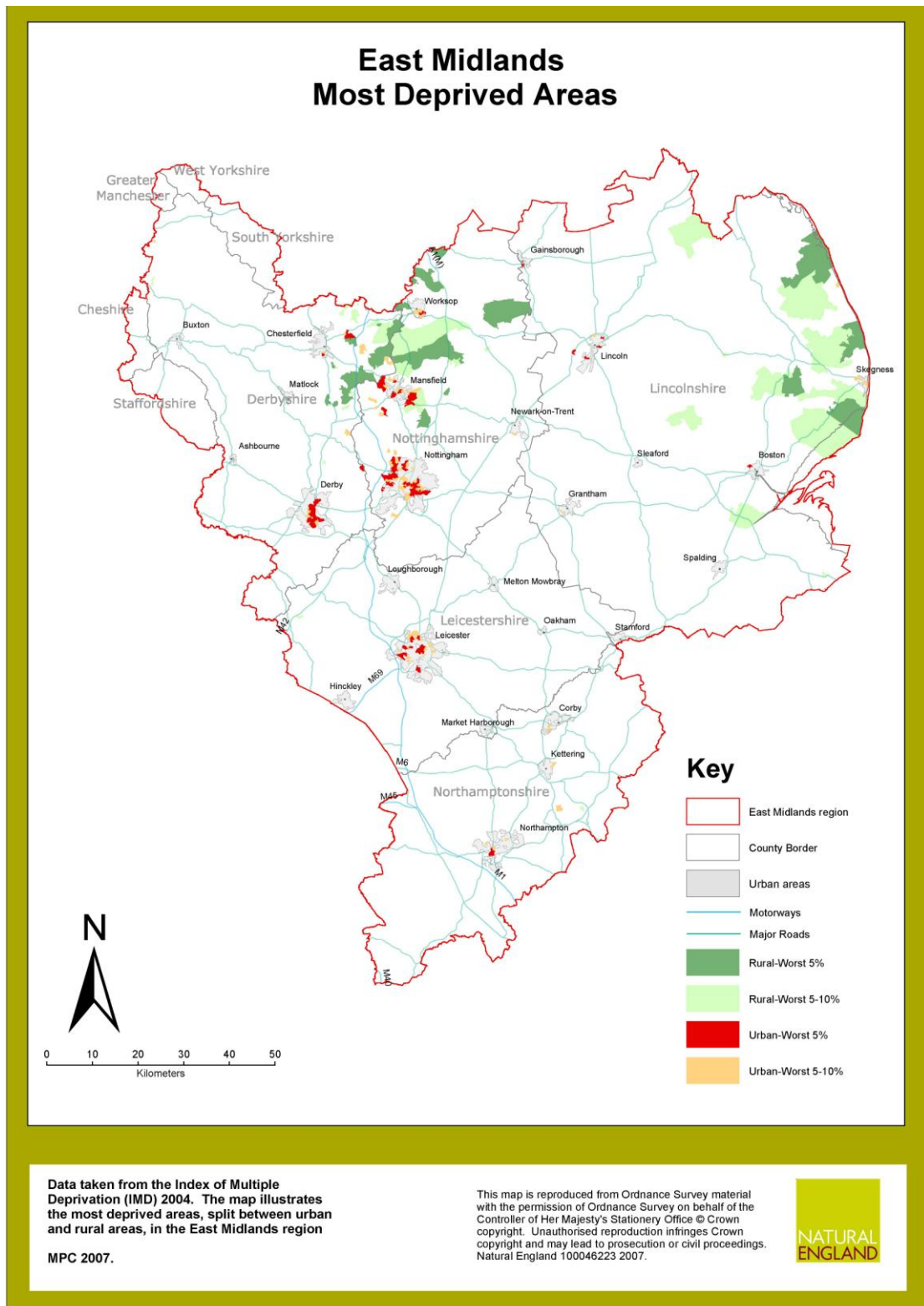

Although projects should address at least one of the priorities highlighted in this statement, applications will be considered for projects outside these priority areas where a good case for funding can be made.

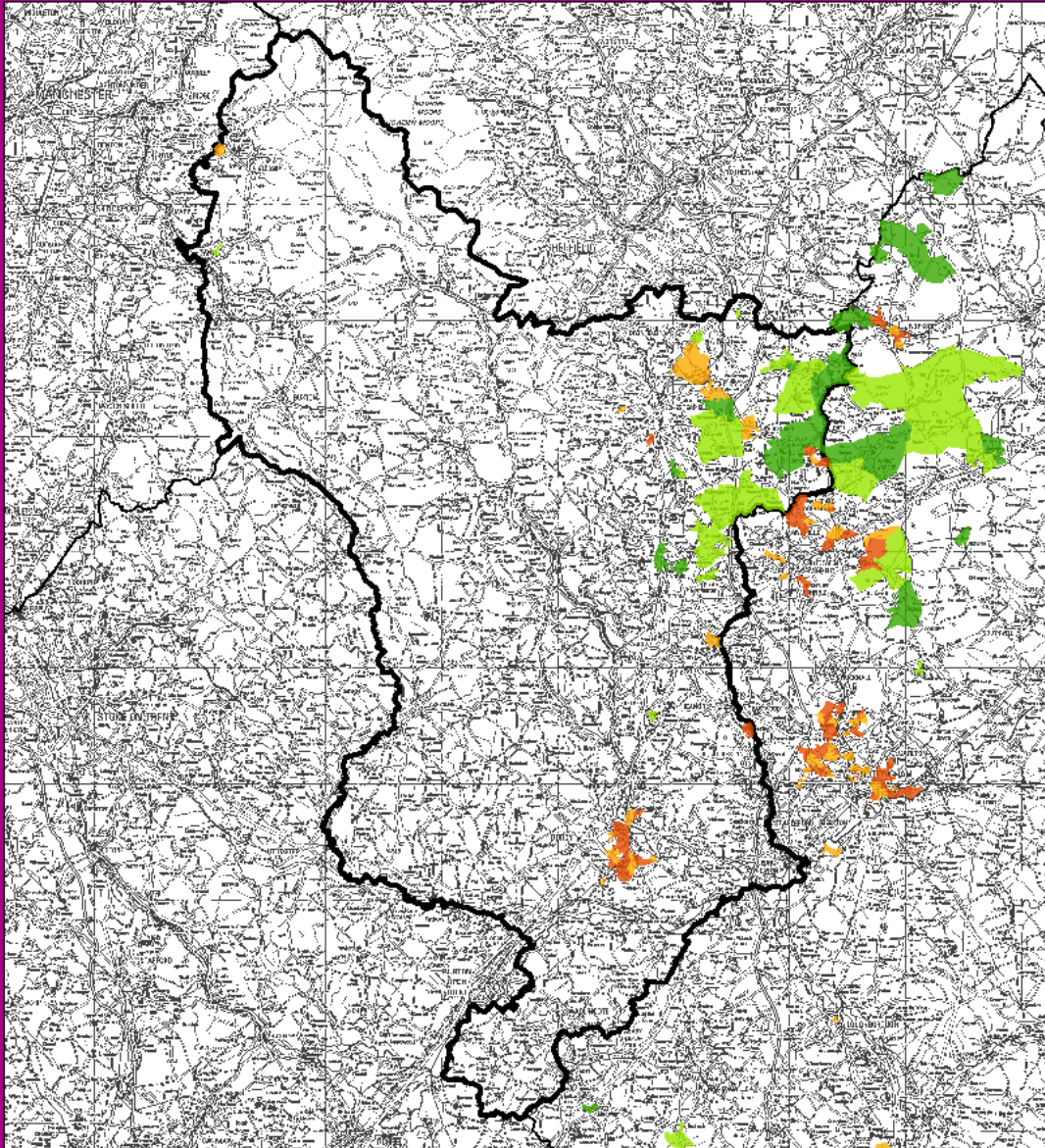

Map of the Region showing Urban and Rural areas of most Deprivation. (Urban shown in red. Rural shown in green)

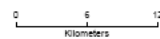
Derbyshire's Most Deprived Areas



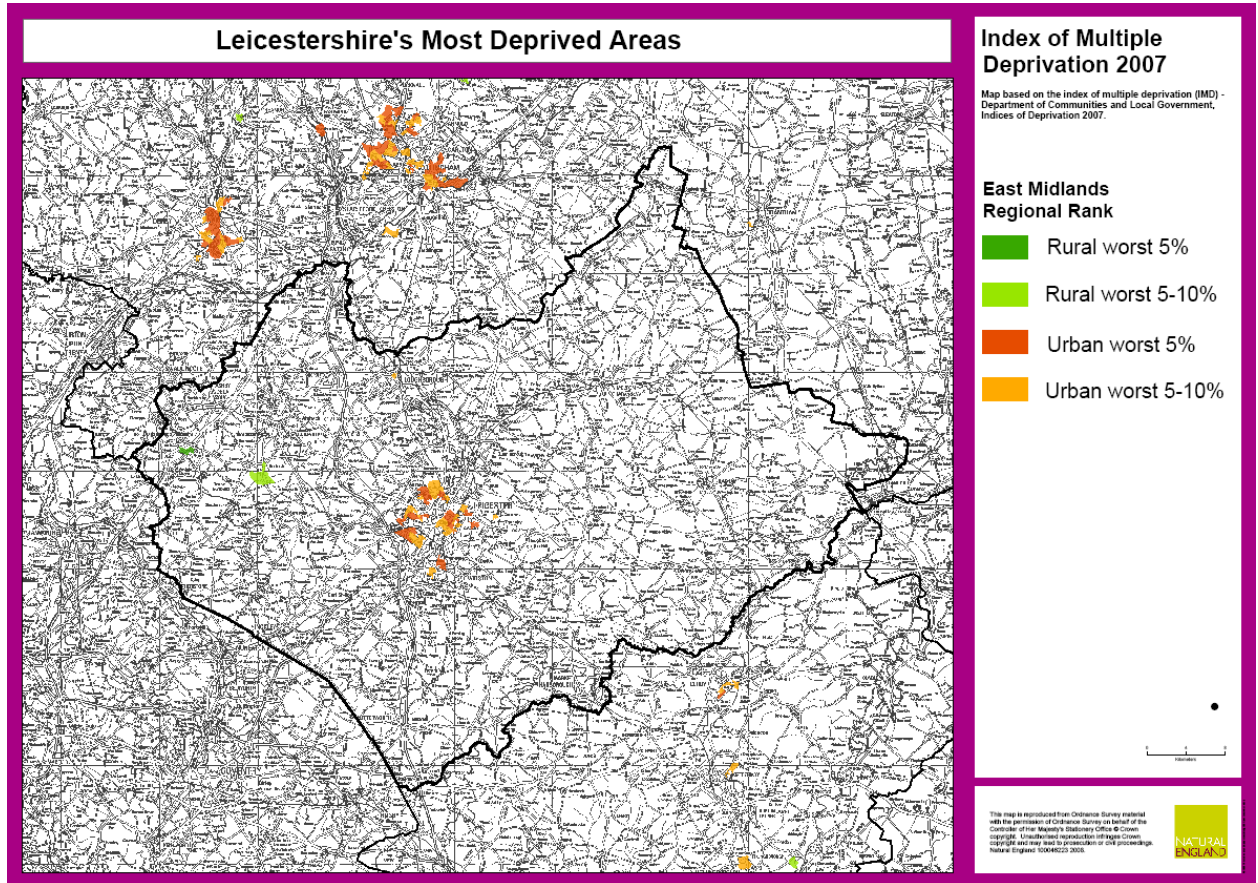
Index of Multiple Deprivation 2007

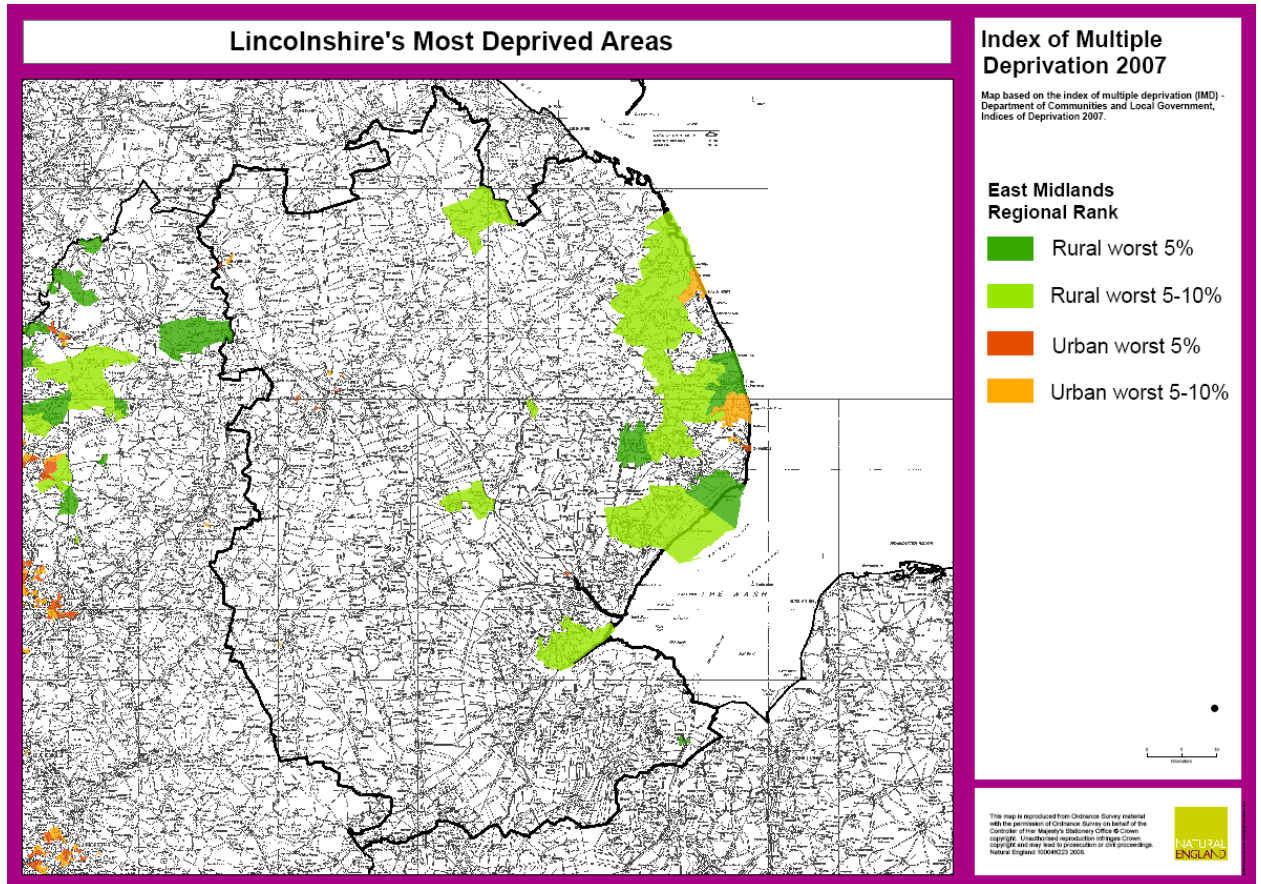
Map based on the index of multiple deprivation (IMD) -

Indices of Deprivation 2007.

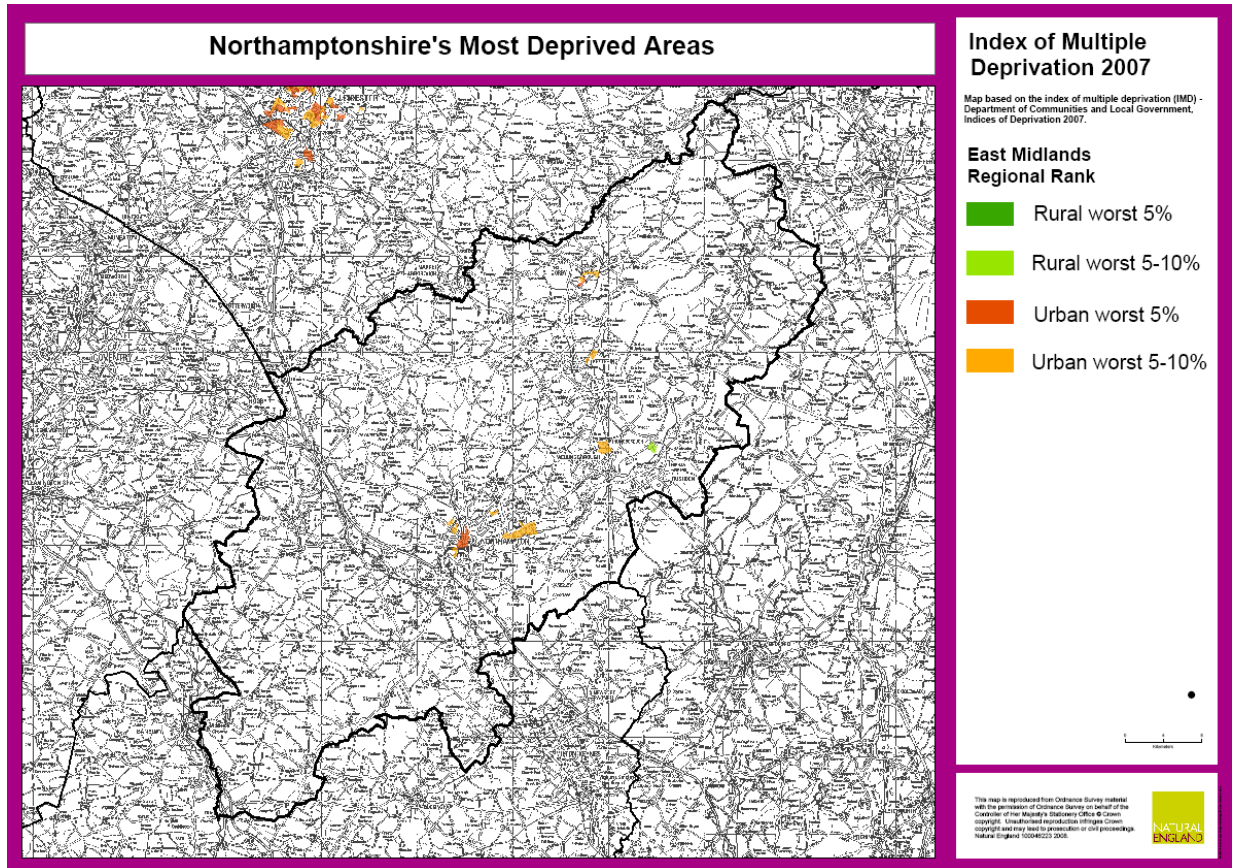
East Midlands Regional Rank



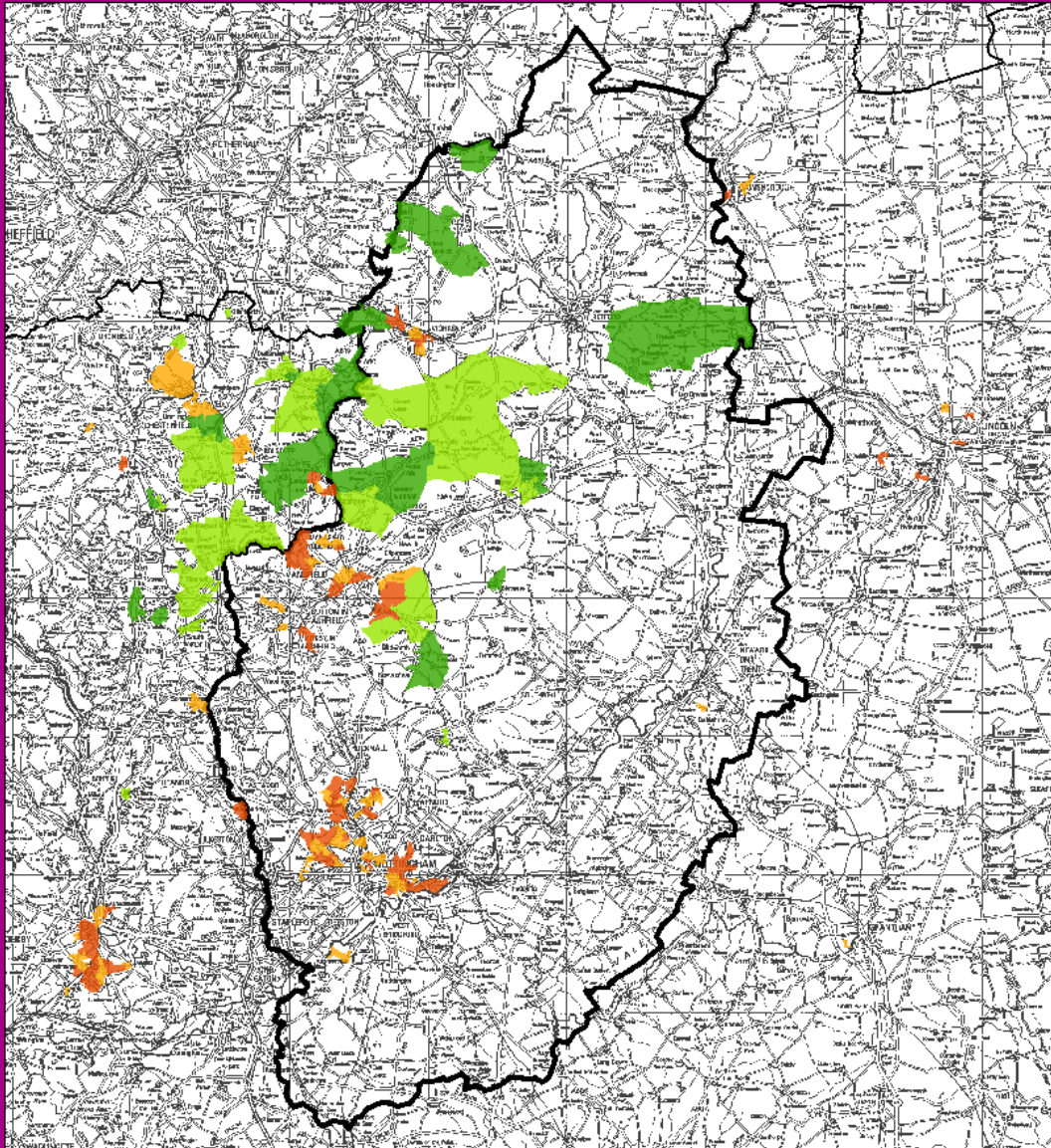
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Nottinghamshire's Most Deprived Areas

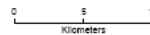


Index of Multiple Deprivation 2007

This Mapping Project used Geographical Information Systems to determine where Green Infrastructure investments might best contribute to the region's aspirations for a vibrant economy, healthy society and quality environment.

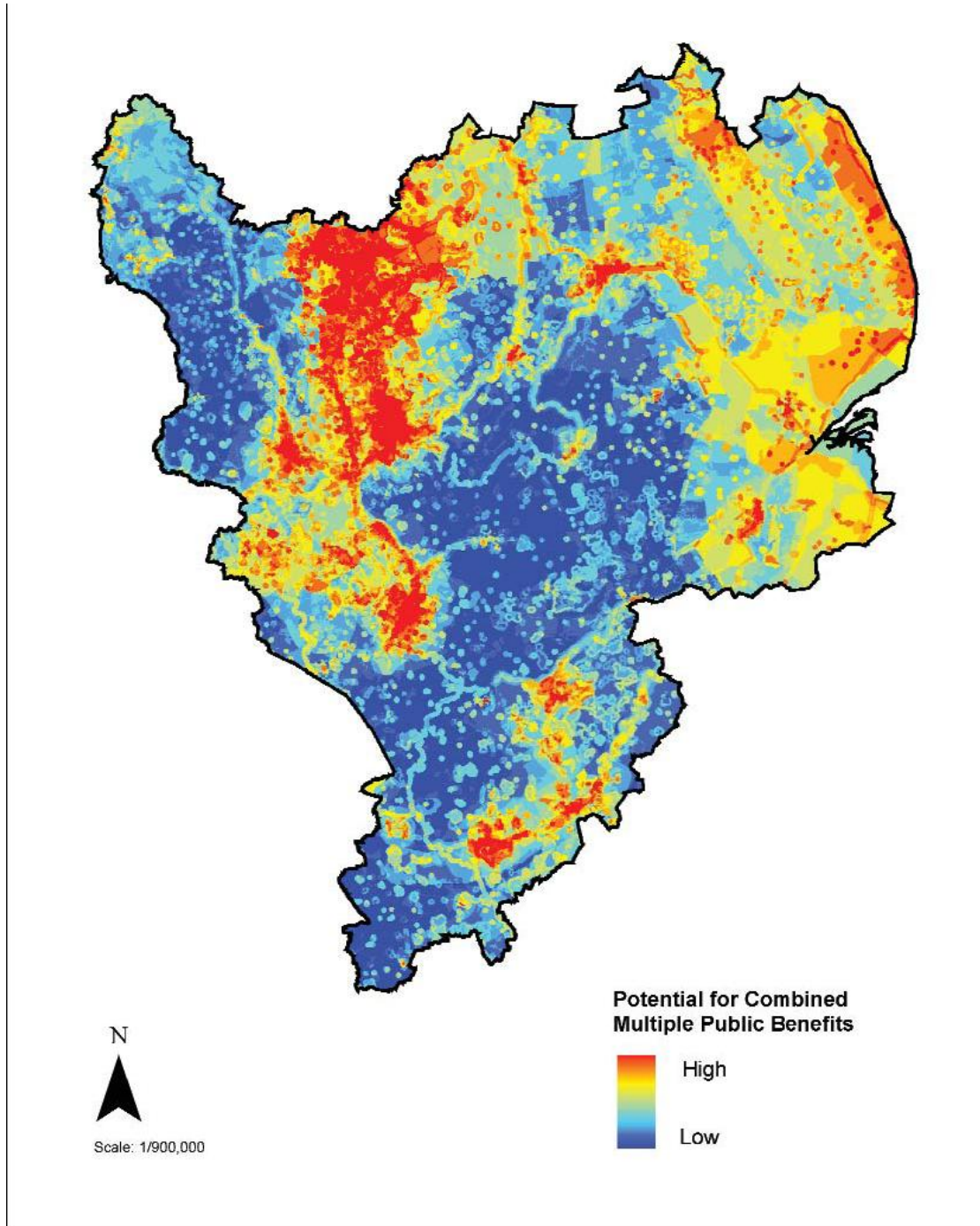
The mapping project was carried out to show where investment in Green Infrastructure could deliver the greatest benefit. 27 'Public benefit' maps were produced showing where the greatest need (e.g. in terms of health, housing, cultural assets) correspond with the greatest potential to deliver green infrastructure.

The resulting **Multiple benefits map** (below) revealed the greatest opportunity for social uplift occurs within the Three Cities Area (Leicester, Derby, Nottingham), the Derbyshire and North Nottinghamshire coalfields, the Lincolnshire coast and Northamptonshire Growth Areas (Milton Keynes and South Midlands).
